1. APOLOGIES

Richard King.

Moved Cr Kett, seconded Cr Ludlow and RESOLVED that the apology be received.

2. MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE EVENTS COMMITTEE HELD ON 27 FEBRUARY 2015

Moved Cr Ludlow, seconded Cr Kett and **RESOLVED** that the Minutes be received as a true and correct record.

3. MATTERS ARISING

4. ACTION SHEET

4.1 Costings for Events Signs

Cr Ludlow said Mr King was in discussions with Carla Forbes regarding the sites for signage. Cr Kett because of rules and regulations from Transit New Zealand, signs were not allowed to be at the entrance to the city. He suggested that perhaps there be signage at Queens Drive. Mr Shadbolt said a good site would be the site at the end of Don Street. Cr Ludlow said this was already a consented site for signage and he would follow this up. Queens Drive and Gala Street were the busiest streets but permission would be needed to be obtained from Parks and Reserves. The Transport Authority and Roading department would also need to have input for this area.

3. FINANCIAL UPDATE

The financial report had been circulated.

A phone call had been received from Repertory who wanted to know if they needed to provide an accountability report. At this stage the answer was no, but Cr Ludlow suggested that there needed to be a processes for accountability and an amendment to the Terms of Reference be made which stated everyone needed to provide accountability and if they full amount had not been spent then the remainder be returned. He would work with Liz Williams to draft the Terms of Reference to be ready for the next meeting. This also included those on the Iconic Events list.

On behalf of Heritage South I would like to thank the Invercargill City Council Events Committee for its generous grant of \$4,000 towards the 2015 CBD Extravaganza as part of Heritage Month.

Heritage South hosted the CBD Extravaganza as part of Heritage Month. This event was a great success drawing a wide range of people into the Invercargill CBD on a Friday evening. It was exciting to see families with children and grandparents enjoying the activity provided. Lots of people dressed up, and comments from those who attended have been great. We surveyed people involved and attending the event and a summary of that survey is attached.

Feedback from this event both from the survey and verbal feedback from participants and retailers has signalled to us that developing this event further would be well supported. We would be interested in working with the ICC in the future to develop this event.

Because we did not receive all the funding we applied for to co-ordinate the CBD Extravaganza we had to make some changes to our budgets and were more reliant on volunteer assistance and donated time.

It should also be acknowledged that the Heritage South Trustees volunteered their time to contribute to making Heritage Month and the CBD Extravaganza a success – they were involved in all elements of the planning and assisting in hosting events and activities. Finally all of the heritage groups, organisations and retailers who were involved in the CBD Extravaganza did so as volunteers and gave very generously to make sure the event was a success. We are very grateful for the great work they all did.

Please find attached the budget for the event and copies of the receipts as applicable.

Thank you once again for your support of this event without which the CBD Extravaganza would not have been possible.

CBD Extravaganza Survey Feedback Summary

29 Respondents – 8 Business/retailer; 4 organisation; 17 general public

Question - Overall what did you think about the CBD Extravaganza?

Overall comments were positive, for example: 'Fantastic and it can only get better,' 'it was a great event and those who attended were all really positive,' 'very good family event,' 'GREAT,' 'Wonderful! Loved how happy people were to share their memories,' and 'was a good start, hope it builds as an event from here.'

Some additional comments with suggestion were included: 'a bit too spread out,' 'a wee bit disappointing in terms of involvement from local businesses and ambience,' 'the Southland Times could have bought into it and got a lot of business and good will for minimal input,' and 'pity more retailers couldn't get involved.'

Question – Which form of advertising did you find most visible?

A wide range of advertising forms were mentioned by respondents – advertising in newspaper, community paper articles, Facebook, CUETV, emails, event websites, Heritage Month booklet, poster, newsletters, personal contact/word of mouth.

Some comments: 'the general public were smothered with publicity,' 'unfortunately some retailers say they were never given the information,' and 'next year there will be the informal advertising from those who went this year.'

Question - Event highlights?

Dress up, vintage cars, vibe around town, window displays, the way people got involved and had a go, horse ride, Daughter of Invercargill film, being in the thick of it, talking to the public, horse and cart, singing, the queen, and young people involvement.

Question - what could we do better?

Events more centralised
People commented there wasn't enough time to do everything
More shops involved
Southland Times coverage on Sat
Close Esk St
Bigger posters/signage
More activity
Treasure hunt difficult for young children

Question - Activities you would have liked to have seen but didn't?

Food, no tours, projector onto building, finish the event with a dance at the Scottish Hall, fashion parade, more for children, more kids involved (schools), not sure and keep building each time.

Question – Would you participate if we did it next year?

Majority said yes or definitely.
One said annual is too often and one said probably not.

Question – We would like to grow the event into a week-long heritage celebration in the CBD – what do you think?

The majority said yes and offered suggestions. 3 or 4 said maybe it is a step too far and we need to build up.

Co-ordinator comments on survey results and verbal feedback

Overall I believe the event was a success. I was pleased with the number of people who attended and they all seemed to be enjoying themselves and getting into the spirit of the event.

Advertising – I believe it is nearly impossible to make sure everyone knows about an event. This is the case with this event where some retailers said they hadn't heard anything about it. The initial notification about the event was in Oct 2014 in a council newsletter to all CBD retailers. Information was also hand delivered to nearly all retailers (one person claimed they had not received the information but then told me that I had given it to a staff member and it was then put in the mail pile and discarded without being read.) There was also information in the newspapers over about 6 months.

Since the event I have talked with retailers who have acknowledged that next time they could do more to ensure their fellow retailers know about it. Certainly if we get more retailers involved in the planning stage next time then this will be a huge advantage.

As for the general public, again it is difficult to ensure people hear about things. I do think more posters in town would have been good and a flyer also prior to the event. Budget constraints affect this though. I would also be keen to build a better relationship with the Times for next time – they were transitioning between editors during March which was a disadvantage.

Event highlights – Really pleased with the range of activity. There was a lack of activity on Tay St though which meant less foot traffic there. Interestingly most of the activity for people to participate in occurred n Dee St. I purposely didn't provide specific information on where activity was happening as I wanted people to wander around the CBD and discover what was happening and discourage people from driving from one place to another.

Do better and what could we do in future – I did not invite food sellers to participate as I believe the CBD contains a range of restaurants and cafes which can provide food for people. People commented that things were too spread out – I am not sure that is a bad thing and I didn't want to discourage anyone who wanted to be involved to be involved.

I believe that in future the event could be planned by a volunteer team comprised of retailers and others keen to be involved and this would help the event grow as people tap into their networks and groups.

Future – Certainly the majority of respondents are keen to see the event happen again and I agree. I also asked about growing the event into a week long one.

My thoughts on this are that we could provide a week of heritage focussed CBD activity including building tours, talks, outdoor movies and entertainment, special events like a high tea down Esk St, a dance or ball, more variety in children's activities ie range of treasure hunts etc, grandparent/grandkids event and end with e CBD Extravaganza.

I believe if we were to do this we should develop a committee to plan it including retailers and enthusiastic people. I would suggest the committee would be overseen by Heritage South and funding etc obtained by them.

I believe this would be a great way to value our heritage. It will also provide the Invercargill CBD with a regular event that could help with rejuvenation there. I believe it could be the catalyst for greater acknowledgement of heritage in general especially with the opening of Transport World later in the year.

The feedback from Heritage Month organisers favours Heritage Month being held every second year. Despite this I feel that the CBD Extravaganza could be held annually.

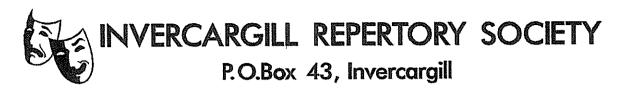

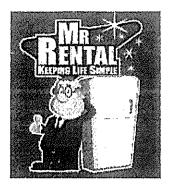

Good evening Councillors,

I am writing to you all to again raise concerns over the Procedural failings of the ICC Events committee.

Last year I raised with the events committee a matter relating to them passing a resolution in Dec2013 awarding \$15K to SMC Events when this item was not on the agenda for the meeting and the item not being added to the agenda in line with both ICC Standing orders and the Local Government Official information and meetings ACT. To date nothing has been done to ratify the decision or correct it.

In January of this year I again requested information from the events committee as it appeared an item not on the agenda had been passed, the original minutes of this meeting are attached below. From these minutes my email below was sent on the 24th February again raising concerns over the processes followed by the Events committee. At the Events Committee meeting on the 27th February an amendment to the minutes was requested by Cr Ludlow, attached within the PDF file below.

While this is quite a lengthy alteration to the minutes and one I find difficult to believe would have been missed in the actual taking of the minutes, I again wish to re-iterate that even this alteration does not meet the requirements of Sec 46A (7) of the LGOIMA.

These amended minutes were confirmed by the events committee this morning with no alterations. As such I draw your attention to Mr Ludlows comments, he had "Signalled a late item" nowhere within the amendment to the minutes was there a "resolution" noted to accept the item under urgent business, which is one of the first aspects of being able to deal with an item, a resolution must state who moved and who seconded the motion, Mr Ludlows comment of "Signalled" and no further comment in regards to a passing of resolution is not compliant with either the ACT or Councils standing orders.

Further, Mr Ludlows re-collection of the item also moves away from both Standing Orders and the ACT as it is the Chair / Presiding member who must give the reasons why and also the reasons why it has to be held in Public exclusion.

As you can undoubtedly see, there are now 2 instances where the Events Committee have breached both Standing Orders and the ACT in terms of dealing with items not on an agenda, and in both instance have failed to remedy the breach.

I am raising this now as I was waiting for the previous minutes to be confirmed as if I had raised this prior I am of the honest belief that a further correction may have been made to appear to be in compliance.

As such I am asking Council to review its Events Committee in terms of procedural correctness and implement processes to ensure the Committee operates as per requirements, and in this vain I refer you to the first part (letter) from Mr King in the PDF file attached in response to me raising an issue with the ICC publicly notifying the April 2nd meeting as "Public Excluded", Mr Kings reply to this, while appreciated is totally inconsistent with both ICC standing orders, the LGOIM Act and all previous meetings. Primarily being that considering to go into Public Exclusion must be done in public, along with all the other std meeting procedures. As such, rather than the ICC admit a fault, a reply was generated to simply brush the matter aside.

46A

- (7) An item that is not on the agenda for a meeting may be dealt with at the meeting if
 - o (a) the local authority by resolution so decides; and
 - o (b) the presiding member explains at the meeting at a time when it is open to the public.—
 - (i) the reason why the item is not on the agenda; and
 - (ii) the reason why the discussion of the item cannot be delayed until a subsequent meeting.

I will let someone pass this onto Cr Dennis as he asked some time back to be taken off my mailing list.

Sec46A (7) and (7A) are unambiguous and specific in how items not on an agenda can be discussed or dealt

with, a key component being that they must be added while the meeting is "Open"to the public, without this they technically can not be dealt with or discussed as the Local Authority has not followed the proper administrative process.

This is not the first time I have raised this matter with the committee and would like to ensure that this matter is dealt with appropriately as this is a committee dealing with public funds and not should not operate like a social club.

The purpose of copying the Chair of the Audit and Risk Committee into this is I feel that the slippage back into improper process needs reviewed and if necessary the committee structure overhauled to ensure sound governance is installed to follow due process.
