

People who attended the Christmas Catch-up were given a sneak preview of plans to put Christmas decorations and lights in Esk Street and Wachner Place.

Graphic Designer Colleen Montgomery explained that the aim is to link Wachner Place and Esk Street up to the H and J Smith air-bridge, with decorations that can be seen during the long summer evenings and also lights that can be seen after dark.

We want it to have a fairy-tale, Christmas feel that is exciting for people of all ages.





ESK STREET UPDATE

Esk Street retailers and businesses were thanked for their patience during the lengthy street upgrade, by Chairman of the Inner City Working Group, Cr Graham Sycamore.

Council's Roading Manager Russell Pearson explained that the project is nearing completion and outlined what still needs to be done.

On the south side of Esk Street:

- Scaffolding will be coming down
- A watering system for the grass under the canopy to be installed
- Gardens and Ready Lawn are to be laid
- The water feature will be turned on
- Lighting is to installed in the canopies

On the north side of Esk Street:

- Steel work will be done next Wednesday
- The glass will be installed the next day

There are still minor repairs to complete but these will be done mostly in the evenings to minimise disruption to retailers.

Cleaning of the pavements and shop frontages will also be undertaken but Council wants to work with businesses to ensure we don't cause any property issues.

Following feedback from retailers, Council will investigate the following:

- More litter bins
- Clean the slot drains and building fronts
- Hose taps
- Trim the tree that is encroaching on the street lamp



What happens next in the CBD?

There is a Council workshop next week to consider the next steps for the CBD project. Options include:

- Improvements on Kelvin Street between Tay Street and Don Street
- Improvements on Esk Street, from the Cambridge Place Arcade to Kelvin Street
- Improvements on Esk Street, from Kelvin Street to Deveron Street
- Identify suitable campervan and bus parking, that encourages travellers to shop in the CBD

Russell said that improvements to Esk Street could include changing parking in the area near Kelvin Street but this needs discussion. Another idea is installing screens along the north footpath in front of the gap between the Kelvin Hotel and The Southland Times to protect people and shops from the effects of the wind tunnel.





Planning for the third Esk Street Mall Market is already underway and organiser Mike Sanford gave a broad outline to the meeting.

The Esk Street Mall Market will be held on Saturday 5 December.

During the brain-storming session, retailers were asked to give ideas on what they would like to see at this event and the suggestions are collated later in this newsletter.

BRAIN-STORMING PRODUCES POSITIVE IDEAS

Retailers and business-people were asked to give their ideas for Esk Street/Wachner Place on four different initiatives that were posted on whiteboards around the room. These were:

- Esk Street Mall Market what would you like?
- Christmas lights' opening how do you see it?

Everyone was given some post-it-notes and a pen and asked to put their ideas on the appropriate white board. There was lots of discussion, collaboration and positive energy.

Every one of the suggestions, in no particular order, is outlined on the following pages.

In coming weeks, we will go through the ideas and come back to retailers and businesspeople in Esk Street and Wachner Place to progress this.

In conclusion, meeting chair, David White, asked Council not to rush off and organise things for the retailers, but instead that retailers would drive the projects and would invite Council to work with them.
