**To Whom it may Concern:**

Further to Bylaw 2015/3 Rooding and Traffic, the Invercargill City Council would like to clarify Clause 5 Signage, Vehicles and Goods on Road with respect to Local Government Elections. This Clause provides control of signage on Invercargill City Council roadways. This exemption does not apply to any State Highways.

This written exemption is provided to Clause 5.1 to clarify Local Government Election signage on motor vehicles and trailers.

*"Fixed signwriting on motor vehicles for the purpose of advertising for the local body elections are exempt from clause 5.1 of Bylaw 2015/3 Rooding and Traffic for a period of six weeks prior to an election and until 8.00am on the Monday following the election.*

*Registered trailers may also only be used for the purpose of election advertising during this period. They must have a permit approved by Council (for this same period as above) and comply with the permit requirements. A trailer may be required to be moved if that location is required for repairs or maintenance to Utilities in the area. "*
