Application for a Permit for Vehicle Crossing Construction in Rural Areas

CONDITIONS

Council permits the installation of accessways in rural areas subject to the following conditions:

- The applicant shall provide, along with the application form, a sketch showing the position of the proposed accessway in relation to property boundaries.
- The siting must be approved by the Roading Manager.
- Access gradients, available off-road standing area, and visibility of approaching traffic shall be adequate to allow safe entry and egress, and shall be as directed by Council's officers.
- The property owner is responsible for all costs involved in installing and maintaining the
 accessway. Contractors that undertake the work shall comply with the Council's Traffic
 Management Policy and submit a Traffic Management Plan and Corridor Access
 Request (CAR) 15 working days prior to commencing work to the Corridor Manager
 <u>corridormanager@icc.govt.nz</u>. No work is to be undertaken until receipt of Works Access
 Permit (WAP). A works completion notice must be signed and returned to Council on
 completion of works.
- The accessway shall be constructed as per the attached standard drawing as amended by Council's Officers. Notification of commencement and completion of the access shall be given to Council's Senior Engineering Officer for work inspection.
- Clegg testing is to be carried out on all vehicle crossing construction by contacting the Quality Assurance Officer on 03 211 1777 for the Clegg test prior to sealing. The Clegg test result required is 35 for the vehicle crossing.
- The property owner is responsible to ensure that the accessway does not restrict existing drainage. Where pipes are required, they shall be of approved diameter and strength, consistent with waterway requirements and loading and shall be to AS/NZS 2566:1 standard. The minimum diameter of pipe shall be 200mm.
- The property owner shall ensure that the accessway and construction materials do not encroach upon the carriageway or create any traffic hazard and shall also ensure that any ditch is kept clear of debris.
- If the road onto which you are seeking access is chip sealed, then the access way must also be chip sealed (see figure R28, R28A, R29, R29B, R30), or as approved by Council.
- This application should be forwarded to the Engineering Services Group, Invercargill City Council, Private Bag 90104, Invercargill.
