



## TEMPORARY HOARDINGS AND SIGNS FOR THE 2017 GENERAL ELECTION

Temporary advertising signs for General Elections may be located within Invercargill City Council's district (*refer attached map*) subject to the following conditions:

1. No hoarding or sign is to be erected on or protrude over a public street, footpath or verge.
2. No hoarding or sign to be erected within nine metres of a street intersection.
3. No hoarding or sign to exceed an area of three square metres.
4. All hoardings and signs are to be non-illuminated.
5. All hoardings and signs on private property can only be erected with the land owner's written approval, which candidates must make available to Council Officers if requested.
6. The written approval of New Zealand Transport Agency must be obtained for any hoardings or signs fronting a State Highway where the set speed limit is greater than 50km/h.
7. No hoarding or sign shall be erected on Council owned land. This includes reserves.
8. The period for which election signs can be displayed starts nine weeks (22 July 2017) before the polling day and ending with the close of the day before polling day (22 September 2017).
9. The Director of Environmental and Planning Services may arrange for non-complying hoardings and signs to be removed and confiscated without notice.
10. Hoardings and signs on trailers and vehicles to be permitted at the discretion of the Roothing Manager (*refer attached information*).

I trust that this information is of assistance, and the Council asks for your cooperation in complying with the conditions.

## ELECTION PERMIT FOR TRAILER ADVERTISING

### CONDITIONS

Council may permit the specific siting of trailers which are supporting advertising signs on city streets, subject to the following conditions:

- (1) Trailers shall only be permitted in 50 km/hour speed restriction areas and exclude any State Highway.
- (2) Trailers shall be sited within a defined parking area either bordered by a painted edgeline or, where sufficient carriageway width allows, a minimum 1.5 metre clearance between the trailer and through traffic.
- (3) Applicants shall obtain prior consent of adjacent property owners before siting a trailer.
- (4) The maximum dimensions of a trailer deck shall be 2.4 metres x 1.5 metres - i.e. 8 feet x 5 feet.
- (5) The advertising sign shall have a maximum height above the trailer deck of 1 metre and shall be securely fixed to the trailer.
- (6) Trailers shall be sited with a minimum clearance of 2 metres from vehicle crossings and 10 metres from intersections.
- (7) Sight distances for motorists entering from adjacent side roads shall be checked to ensure that clear lines of visibility between approaching drivers are maintained and not obscured by the trailer or advertising sign.
- (8) Trailers shall be removed before nightfall.
