REPORT

Kumagaya

When visiting Kumagaya I always begin my official speeches with a tribute to Mr Yagihashi and Mr Hoskiyama who played a major role in maintaining our Sister City relationship for over 24 years.

There have been numerous exchanges during that time with three Southland runners taking part in the Kumagaya marathon, the Japanese Premiere of the World's Fastest Indian, Dancing with the Stars, Piping Hot, Maori Cultural groups, the Rugby World 7's and the Japanese Garden to name just a few events. However, the most numerous exchange has been in the Education sector. Recent estimates show that approximately 2500 students from Kumagaya have visited Invercargill and 1500 students from Invercargill have visited Kumagaya.

In terms of economic benefits over 20% ownership of the Tiwai Smelter belongs to Sumitomo of Japan and 80% of the ingots are exported to Japan. In emotional terms the Rugby World Cup is generating the most excitement and several sporting exchanges are presently being negotiated.
