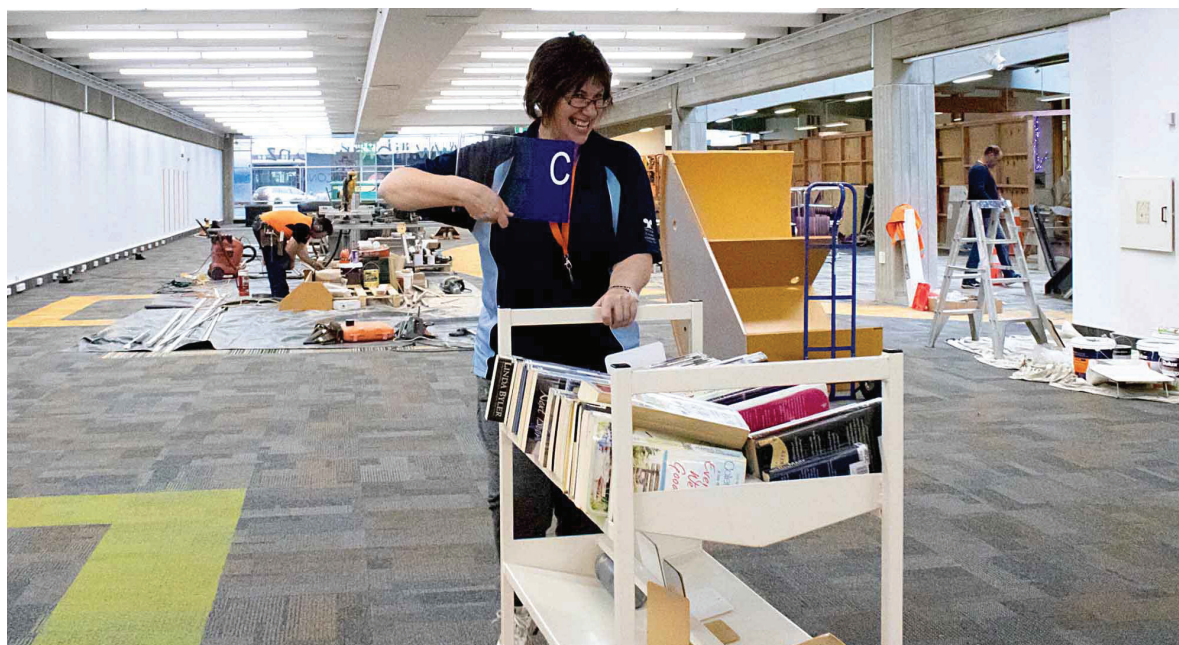


## Temporary borrowing restrictions for Library refurbishment

As changes are made to the Adult's fiction area during the Library refurbishment, the public will need to request any books they wish to borrow until Wednesday, August 29.

**THERE** has been limited access to all the collections, currently on the ground floor, while they are moved. This move began on August 22.

The Adult's fiction area will not be accessible to the public during this time, which means books from this collection can only be borrowed by request.

Libraries and Archive Manager Marianne Foster said the move began with adult fiction, followed by large print, young adult material, graphics, audio books, magazines, DVDs and multimedia, with children's collections being the last to move. "Our staff will be available to retrieve specific books for you during this time, however the collections may not be available for browsing," Ms Foster said.

Adult non-fiction, biographies, newspapers, and computers will still be freely available on the first floor.

Ms Foster said clubs and programmes will continue to run during this time, however may be in a different location.

Anyone with any questions should ask help desk staff.

Meanwhile, this next stage of refurbishment will also affect hours of access to the Library building via the car parking building.

At present, the library access doors open before 8am to allow people to walk through to Dee Street, however during this stage of the refurbishment, the doors will not open until 9am.

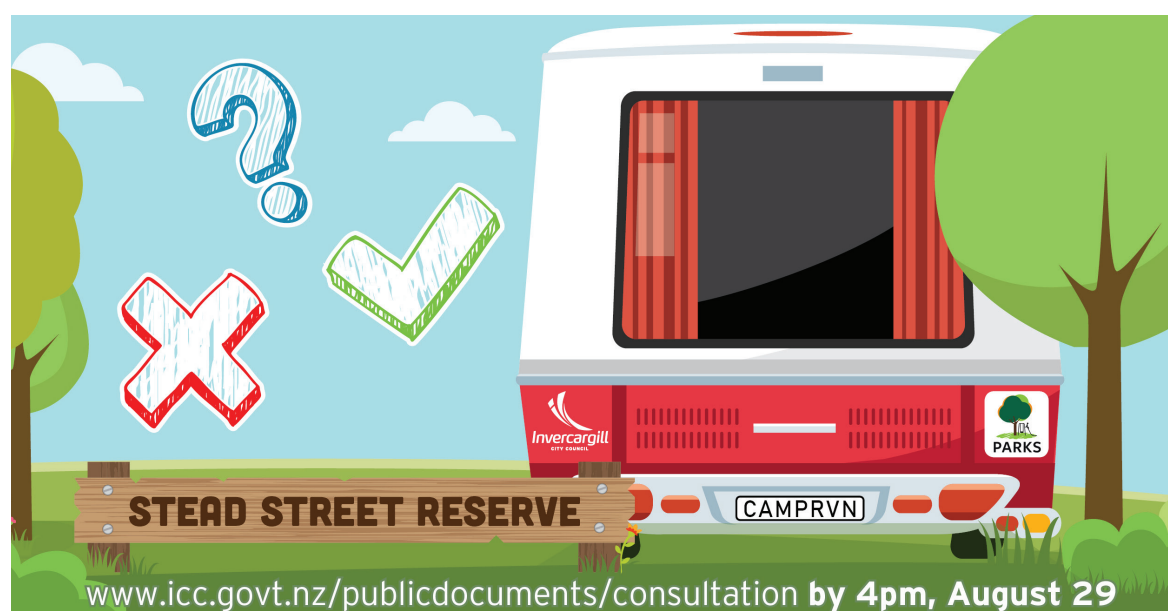
Dee Street access will be available by exiting the orange side door on Level 2 of the car parking building, and using the lane between Speights Alehouse and Tuatara Backpackers

## Final days to have your say on camping at Stead Street Reserve

**AN** application has been received from the New Zealand Motor Caravan Association to lease an area of approximately 5,600m<sup>2</sup> of land at Stead Street adjacent to the wharf for the association's members to use.

Part of this land is reclaimed infrastructure land and the other part is reserve land.

The Management Plan for Stead Street does not allow for

camping on the reserve.

Policy 3.19 Camping, of the Management Plan currently states that "camping is not permitted on reserves within this Management Plan".

It is proposed that this policy is amended to allow for camping specifically at Stead Street Reserve within the boundaries provided.

The Council is seeking

feedback from the community on this proposal in accordance with section 41 of the Reserves Act 1977.

## ILT hotel submissions open



**THE** Council has received a resource consent application from the Invercargill Licensing Trust to build a new hotel on the corner of Don and Dee Streets.

One element of the application is to demolish a Class 2 heritage building (the former T & G building), along with other buildings which do not have a heritage classification. The T & G building is protected by

the Invercargill City District Plan, but is not on Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga's protection list.

Another element of the application is to construct and operate a new, eight-level hotel which will incorporate 80 hotel suites, a restaurant, café, bars, function spaces, car parking, and other guest facilities.

The application has been fully

notified under the Resource Management Act 1991.

Full notification means that anyone may make a submission, for or against the proposal.

Submissions can be made using the fillable form, which can be found via [www.icc.govt.nz/public-documents/consultation/](http://www.icc.govt.nz/public-documents/consultation/)

Submissions need to be lodged with the Council by Thursday,

September 13 at the latest, and you must serve a copy of your submission on the ILT via the details provided in the application.

If you indicate on your submission that you wish to be heard, you will be asked if you would like to make an oral submission at a hearing later this year.
