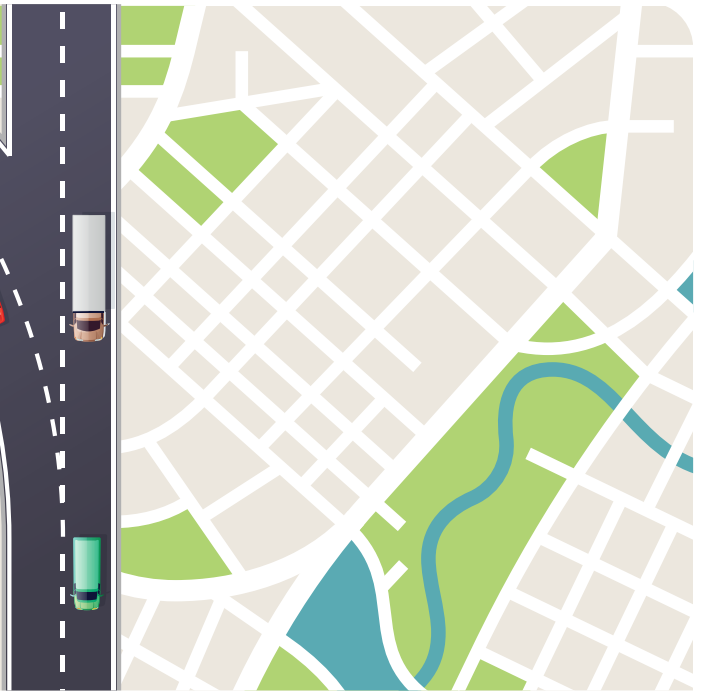


Roading and Traffic Bylaw 2020

REVIEW AND AMENDMENTS CONSULTATION OVERVIEW



What is being proposed?

Invercargill City Council is reviewing, and proposing amendments to its Roding and Traffic Bylaw.

Council is not proposing any significant changes to the bylaw. There has been some new sections added to it relating to cycle paths, cruising, and shared zones to better align our Bylaw with others throughout New Zealand and to provide clarity to the public.

There have also been some updates made to definitions and minor changes to some rules.

Why is this being proposed?

Council must review its bylaws regularly. We're consulting with you to make sure we reflect the community's desires to have controls in place to ensure safety while keeping our roads easy to use.

What else do I need to know?

There is no proposal to change any of the speed limits in the Bylaw, with a speed review planned for 2021. However, submitters are welcome to share their thoughts with Council on speed limits now, for consideration as part of this process as well as the speed review next year.

At this stage, the Bylaw review process does not take into account any future City Centre proposals or changes. These will be revisited next year as part of the implementation of the City Centre Master Plan.

How do I have my say?
