Moving from New Delhi to **Invercargill more than 16** years ago, Himani Mishra never imagined that through her story of struggle, she would go on to help hundreds of new migrant families.

Unfortunately, within two weeks of arriving in Invercargill, Himani and her son soon found themselves on their own, but that didn't discourage her from making her new life work.

"I needed to keep going for my son and I was determined not to move home. At that time, there wasn't really any help or support for migrants so it was quite challenging figuring out where to go and who to talk to."

But Himani soon found her way and by utilising her network and asking lots of questions from work colleagues and friends, her and her son were soon flourishing in Invercargill.

And in 2017 she founded Southland Migrants Walking Together, an organisation that aims to enable, engage and empower migrants, refugees and former refugees to create a truly multicultural Southland.

To date, the organisation has helped hundreds of migrant families find their feet and make new connections across the region. As well as establishing the Southland Hindi School, the organisation also offers a migrant support playgroup and a programme dedicated to migrant women and their children.



"As first-generation migrants it's so important that as well as establishing a life in Invercargill, we make sure we are staying connected to our children and keeping an eye on their mental health and their emotional needs."

Himani's top tips for new migrants with children:

- → As new migrants, don't forget that your children will also be experiencing many of the same thoughts and feelings that you are - stay connected and look after each other.
- → After school care, local church groups and the library can be great places for your children to meet others and start to make friends.
- → Keep in touch with your child's school and teachers to make sure they're receiving the right support and are settling in well.





When Yudi Suseno made the move from Indonesia to Invercargill to study sports and exercise at SIT, he never dreamed that he would go from being a student to owning an F45 Training gym in just four short years.

One of the first things Yudi did when arriving was to establish a strong network by getting out and exploring his new home and meeting a wide range of people.

"It's really important to make friends outside of other people who come from your country. Be brave, get out there, meet new people and get involved in the local community even if it's through volunteer work."

Moving from a home town of 1 million people to a city of 50,000 was a bit of a change but Yudi has embraced the slower pace of life.

"The change in weather was a bit of a shock but you soon get used to it. In Invercargill everything's so close and within walking distance. It's got some amazing outdoor spaces for you to explore. It's a great place to live and I'm very proud to call Invercargill home."

Yudi's top tips:

- → Invest in a good quality, waterproof jacket to keep you warm and dry especially in winter.
- → Get out and explore your backyard - there's heaps of amazing outdoor activities you can do locally, even just walking around Queens Park.
- → A can-do attitude will get you a long way - make the most of any opportunities that come your way.

When Denisse Perdomo and her family made the move from South America to Invercargill, more than a year ago, she never expected to receive the warm welcome that the local community has given her.

"Since the moment we arrived everyone has been so kind to our entire family. Our daughters have been welcomed and embraced by their local school community and my husband and I have both found jobs we really enjoy."

Coming from busy Uruguay, Denisse and her family were encouraged to make the move from a close friend who had mentioned the job opportunities within the primary sector.

Since relocating, her family has really embraced the slower pace of life that Invercargill has to offer.

"We're still amazed at the beauty and tranquillity of Invercargill. Everything is so clean and the air is so pure. We feel very lucky to call this home."




Denisse's top tips:
