Heritage South 2024/2025 Accountability Agreement 4.

Ms Baxter advised the Committee that Council annually donated \$3,000 to Heritage South towards events held during Southland Heritage Month that pertain specifically to the built heritage of the city centre. Heritage South had recently requested that Council consider updating the Accountability Agreement to allow the donation to be put towards events (of the same focus) held outside Southland Heritage Month (March).

Cr Arnold raised a query regarding whether Heritage South was aware that no extra funds would be awarded other than the \$3000 initially agreed upon. Ms Baxter advised that there was no change to the funding amount, just the timeframe.

Cr Campbell raised a query regarding the agreement terminology and advised that it excludes Bluff. The Subcommittee discussed the unfairness of exclusions due to the specific wording of 'City Centre' in the agreement. Ms Baxter advised that the wording reflects the geographical focus of the City Centre Heritage Strategy. Cr Campbell advised that the Subcommittee could discuss potential changes to wording in the agreement before the 2025/2026 Accountability Agreement was drafted next year.

Ms Baxter advised that Heritage South were very grateful and would appreciate the change in wording so they could access the funds outside of Heritage Month.

Purpose and Summary

The purpose of this report is to provide the City Centre Heritage Subcommittee with an update on progress made for the City Centre Heritage Strategy and associated deliverables since the last meeting (29 May 2024).

Recommendations

That the City Centre Heritage Subcommittee:

1. Receives the report "Update on City Centre Heritage Strategy Progress".

Background

- 1. Heritage funding:
 - a. Progress Made on Round 5 (2023-2024) Awarded Works:
 - i. Lennel (102 Albert Street):
 - Partial funding (\$28,559) has been uplifted for portions of the following work: roof replacement, roof insulation, earthworks, scaffolding, and interior building repairs.
 - Staff have been advised by the owner that the remainder of the funding will be forfeited, leaving \$21,953 to be uplifted.
 - ii. (Former) Dee Street Maternity Hospital (194 Dee Street):
 - Condition assessment work by Origin consultants is underway.
 - Seismic strengthening report is currently underway.

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- iii. Trenthouse (61A-E Tay Street):
 - Full funding (\$7,000) has been uplifted for seismic strengthening detail design.
 - Full funding (\$50,000) has been uplifted for strengthening works.
- iv. Several applicants are waiting for the weather to improve before undertaking exterior works. Council staff are in regular contact with them regarding timelines. Applicants are aware work is to be completed and invoiced by May 2025.
- b. Possible changes to funding Round 6 (2024/2025):
 - i. It has been recommended by Finance that the timing of our funding round changes. They have suggested the annual funding round (typically closing in early March) instead close in May to allow the Subcommittee to award funds after the Annual Plan is signed off in late June and budgets are confirmed.
 - ii. It has also been recommended that applicants have a shorter timeframe to complete the works. At the moment they have one year to complete and another year to uplift the funding. In order to better align with the annual plan, Finance has suggested to amend the timeframe for completion of works and uplift of funding to ten months.
 - iii. Any decisions about changes to the funding programme is to be confirmed at a future date.

2. Strategy deliverables:

- a. City Centre Heritage Design Guidelines:
 - i. Work has begun on the third, and final, guideline document. Text is complete and consultant is working on illustrations.
- b. Interpretive Funding:
 - i. Oral History Project Heritage South unveiled their website in late August 2024, partially funded by Council's Heritage funds. Three heritage buildings have been profiled so far; the information focuses on stories/memories associated with the buildings. More buildings will be added with time.
 - ii. No heritage interpretation funding is going forward due to changes to the Heritage Strategy budget.
- c. Heritage Month 2025:
 - i. Heritage New Zealand Pouhere Taonga has requested Council assistance with organising a talk on insuring heritage buildings during Heritage Month. This is in response to them seeing misinformation on the subject nationwide.

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- d. Sharing Local Heritage news:
 - i. Planning staff are to work with the Communications team to clarify what heritage content will be posted and how to increase visibility of heritage funding.
- 3. Miscellaneous Heritage Items:
 - a. Several heritage properties are currently on sale or going to market (Masonic Hall, Briscoe's Building, Commodore Apartments and Yule House).
 - b. Various heritage owners are looking for additional revenue streams during tight times. As such, the Planning team is seeing an increase in resource consent enquiries for heritage building alterations.

Issues

The implementation of the City Centre Heritage Strategy encourages support the retention of our heritage buildings.

Next Steps

There are no actions or follow-up reports required as a consequence of this report.

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
