This is an application by Stephen Russell for a Manager's Certificate.

GADOOCHI BREWING LIMITED - APPLICATION FOR NEW OFF LICENCE

We act for the Invercargill Licensing Trust ("ILT").

The application is for an off-licence to sell alcohol from the premises at 17 Bond Street and on the basis of remote sales. We understand that the application is not to be endorsed under section 40 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 ("the Act") and therefore signage and display requirements apply. We note this Application is effectively to replace the previous licence at the premises which expired in August 2024. That licence was for remote sales only.

Our client has been made aware of the Police's view of this application. In short, the Police do not object but seek the imposition of a condition on the off-licence that ensures only alcohol as outlined by the Applicant may be sold. Our client shares this view although we expand on the reasons set out below.

The details of what the Applicant intends to sell is recorded in correspondence from the Applicant. An extract from that correspondence is quoted as follows:

"What we are wanting to do is to sell the bulk of taps as Gadoochi beer/cider as this is where the largest amount of profit is for us, and have taps available for guest brewers to cover ourselves in case not all our customers want Gadoochi all the time. We also want to have for sale Gadoochi bottled products and bottled "craft beer" from other breweries. What we are not wanting to do is, sell RTDs, mainstream beers/ciders, mainstream spirits, anything that is readily available online at supermarkets or large bottle shops. Creating and nourishing the Gadoochi brand is first and foremost on our minds."

We do not provide any challenge to the ability of a brewery selling its own products to obtain an off-licence in a Trust District. Section 350 of the Act excludes off-licences in a Trust District except for a licence akin to a wine reseller's licence or for premises on which any kind of alcohol is made. However, the intention to sell other products under a manufacturers off-licence raises some issues.

In 2019 Gadoochi sought an off-licence to manufacture and sell alcohol from the premises situated at the Tuatara Lodge, 30-32 Dee Street Invercargill. That application was declined by the Invercargill District Licensing Committee following a hearing on 27 September 2019. In its decision the Committee specifically noted that the intention to sell other brewer's product conflicted with Section 350 and the Act did not have other provisions that would enable Gadoochi to do this.

Gadoochi's remote sales off-licence granted on 31 August 2023 included a condition that prevented the sale of products other than those manufactured by Gadoochi. That condition was imposed by consent following objections raised by our client and the Police.

Gadoochi's latest application creates two primary concerns:

- 1. There is no evidence or analysis provided to enable a proper determination as to whether the principal business of the premises will be the manufacture of alcohol Section 32(1)(d). The only comment is that the bulk of taps will be Gadoochi beer/cider. It is a real risk that other brewer's products will account for a significant portion of revenue (more akin to a retail bottle store).
- 2. The sale of non-manufactured product is potentially in conflict with section 350.

Our client has not instructed us to formally object to the application but rather suggest that conditions should be imposed on the grant of an off-licence to deal with the above issues. The Act gives the Licensing Committee the power to impose any reasonable conditions on the off-licence that are not inconsistent with the Act.

We suggest a condition be imposed such as:

Gadoochi Brewing will only sell products manufactured by Gadoochi Brewing Limited or craft beer supplied by other breweries. The sale of all other alcohol products is not permitted.

Background to the application

The applicant Gadoochi Brewing Limited currently hold a National Programme 3 registration (ICC001083/1) under the Food Act 2015 for their brewery located at the same site; 17 Bond Street, Invercargill.

On 31 August 2023, this business was granted an OFF licence endorsed under s40 of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 for remote sales only. This licence expired on 31 August 2024. Following this they have now applied for this OFF licence to operate a cellar door type premises.

This premises is located in the Invercargill Licensing Trust (ILT) area. However, under s350 (1) (b) (ii), an OFF licence can be issued for any premises on which any kind of alcohol is made.

On 27 September 2024, the applicant sent an email to the ILT stating their intent as:

"What we are wanting to do is to sell the bulk of taps as Gadoochi beer/cider as this is where the largest amount of profit is for us, and have taps available for guest brewers to cover ourselves in case not all our customers want Gadoochi all the time. We also want to have for sale Gadoochi bottled products and bottled "craft beer" from other breweries. What we are not wanting to do is, sell RTDs, mainstream beers/ciders, mainstream spirits, anything that is readily available online at supermarkets or large bottle shops. Creating and nourishing the Gadoochi brand is first and foremost on our minds."

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STATUTORY CRITERIA

The Object of the Act

The Host Responsibility Policy that was submitted to support this the application, if followed correctly, will ensure the sale, supply and consumption of alcohol will be undertaken safely and responsibly and the harm caused by the excessive or inappropriate consumption of alcohol should be minimised.

The application states that they will ensure ID checks are made, alcohol will not be served to intoxicated people, the online ordering will have a tick box at the beginning and end of the transaction. They have also stated that free water in filled jugs with glasses will be stationed on the main counter when free samples are available.

Other steps mentioned are that their licence will be visible on their website and they will educate customers on alcohol percentages.

Suitability of the Applicant

The applicant is Gadoochi Brewing Limited.

The applicant Gadoochi Brewing Limited submitted an application to the Invercargill District Licensing Committee on 6 September 2024 to grant an Off Licence in respect of premises situated at 17 Bond Street, Invercargill and to be known as Gadoochi Brewing.

Gadoochi Brewing Limited was incorporated under the Companies Act 1993 on 20 March 2019. The Companies Register shows that the following people are Directors of Gadoochi Brewing Limited:

To my knowledge the premises file contains no information or matters of concern with regard to the applicant. The New Zealand Police have not made me aware of any incidents at 17 Bond Street, Invercargill.


Any Local Alcohol Policy

The Local Alcohol Policy was adopted on 6 December 2019. The Local Alcohol Policy covers the following:

SENSITIVE PREMISES

The Local Authority Compliance Certificate dated 10 October 2024 confirmed the applied activity is permitted and is in the Industrial 2 zone under the Invercargill City District Plan 2019. Sensitive sites consultation did not identify any such sites within 50 m of 17 Bond Street, Invercargill:

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TRADING HOURS:

Off licences: The hours between 7.00 am on any day to 11.00 pm the same day and includes dedicated "bottle store" outlets and "across the bar" sales.

This application is for: Monday to Sunday -9.00 am to 9.00 pm. These hours are within the above-described LAP hours.

DISCRETIONARY CONDITIONS

The Local Alcohol Policy allows for discretionary conditions to be imposed on Licences. The following should be considered:

A. Premises layout and design

The floor plan, application information and the site visit lead me to believe that the design and layout of the premises is appropriate.

B. Staffing

- (i) Training requirements for staff
- (ii) Management requirements in relation to staff (e.g., number of staff, duty managers)

The application has detailed adequate staffing.

C. Host responsibility

- Steps to prevent sales to minors
- Requiring the presence of a Duty Manager

D. Amenity and good order

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- (i) Cleaning the outside of the premises and immediate environs
- (ii) Use of CCTV
- (iii) Signage and advertising

E. Management of incidents

- (i) Licensee to keep a register of incidents
- (ii) Mandatory notification to Police of violent incidents

Best practice is for all licensees to record any issues that occur.

F. CPTED Principles.

Licensees should consider CPTED principles when designing premises.

The days on which and the hours during which the applicant proposes to sell alcohol

The applicant wishes to sell alcohol from Monday to Sunday – 9.00 am to 9.00 pm.

These hours are within the default hours of the Act and Local Alcohol Policy and are appropriate for this type of establishment.

The design and layout of the premises

Premises layout and principal entrance

The subject off licence area is located within the Gadoochi brewery building at 17 Bond Street. A floor plan formed part of the application submitted on 6 September 2024, as shown in figure 1. The principal entrance is off Bond Street. This entrance to the retail area is to the left of the brewery entrance.

During the site visit on 1 October, the retail area was being set up. At the time, it was observed that a serving counter was built in front of the beer taps and there was a double door fridge to the left of the counter. These can be seen in the photos below. Online CPTED guidance was referred to and discussed with Nicola McGilvray.

This premises is not in the permanent alcohol ban area and there aren't any other licensed premises in this industrial area.

Designations

This premises designation will be supervised.

Recommendation

It is recommended a copy of the scale plan of the premises be attached to the OFF Licence.

Provision of food, low alcoholic and non-alcoholic drinks (including water)

The applicant has detailed that water will be available from filled jugs with glasses that will be stationed on the main counter when alcohol is being provided free as a sample on the premises.

The sale of goods and the provision of services other than those directly relating to the sale of alcohol, low and non-alcoholic refreshments and food

Host Responsibility Policy

A satisfactory Host Responsibility Policy was submitted on 22 November 2024 to support this application.

Whether the amenity and good order of the locality would be likely to be increased, by more than a minor extent, by the effects of a refusal to renew the licence

The premises are situated at 17 Bond Street, Invercargill in the Industrial 2 zone.

Invercargill City Council records have been searched and have shown no substantiated complaints in regards to the Brewery operating at this site. The New Zealand Police have not raised any concerns in regards to nuisance complaints or Police calls for services.

From the information available to the Inspector, I have no reason to believe that this premises decreases the amenity and good order of the area by more than a minor extent.

The manner in which the applicant has sold (or as the case may be, sold and supplied), displayed, advertised, or promoted alcohol

Gadoochi Brewery Limited currently operates as a manufacturing brewery to produce cider and in future will move the beer brewing from their Tuatara Café site on Dee Street to 17 Bond Street site. I have not seen, or been made aware of any incidents that involve the premises or advertising so it has particular appeal to minors nor discounted alcohol by more than 25% in relation to their previous remote sales licence.

During my visit to the premises on 1 October 2024, the following business proposals were presented by Nicola McGilvray:

Manufacture

Current: Cider is already being brewed at Gadoochi Brewery at 17 Bond Street site and beer at the Tuatara Dee Street site.

Going forward: Beer will also be brewed at Bond Street; and Dee Street site continues to brew beer.

Sales and Intent

- 1. Initially sales of own beers and ciders will take place from shop retail area.
- Nicola discussed intentions to sell local products; beers from craft breweries throughout the country, gin from Arrowtown and Stewart Island, whiskey from Auld Distillery, port from Central Otago and wines from central Otago orchards.
- 3. Remote sales from their website Gadoochi.
- 4. Future plans ON licence in the brewery area to have bands, functions starting with Special licence. Food will be brought in other registered food caravans and their own Tuatara food caravan which is being built.

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Any matters dealt with in any report from the Police or Medical Officer of Health Agencies

The New Zealand Police and Medical Officer of Health had no objections to the application. However, the New Zealand Police have considered Section 350(1)(b)(ii) and its their belief that the intention of this section does restrict the Off Licence to enable the licensee to sell their own products at a retail level from their premises, or products of a similar nature. Therefore, New Zealand Police have recommended that the DLC consider imposing a condition on the Off Licence to ensure only alcohol as outlined by the applicant can be sold as per the email to the ILT on 27 September 2024:

What we are wanting to do is to sell the bulk of taps as Gadoochi beer/cider as this is where the largest amount of profit is for us, and have taps available for guest brewers to cover ourselves in case not all our customers want Gadoochi all the time. We also want to have for sale Gadoochi bottled products and bottled "craft beer" from other breweries. What we are not wanting to do is, sell RTDs, mainstream beers/ciders, mainstream spirits, anything that is readily available online at supermarkets or large bottle shops.

OTHER MATTERS

Notifications

Advertisements were published on the Council website on 18 September 2024 and the Site Notice was displayed in accordance with the Act.

Objections

There were no objections received during the advertising period. However, a letter of recommendation dated 24 October 2024 was received from Ward Adams Bryan-Lamb Barristers and Solicitors on behalf of Invercargill Licensing Trust (ILT). It suggested condition similar to the Police:

Gadoochi Brewery will only sell products manufactured by Gadoochi Brewing Limited or craft beer supplied by other breweries. The sale of other alcohol products is not permitted.

It is noted that ILT did not oppose to this application.

Fire Evacuation Scheme/Procedure

New Zealand Fire Service were notified of this application on 15 September 2024. They have not reported.

RECOMMENDATION

As the Licensing Inspector, I have no opposition to the issue of this Off Licence.

The Act states in section 350 (1)(b)(ii):

Unless and until a competition proposal is carried in respect of a licensing trust to which this section applies, then, despite any of the other provisions of this Act, —

(b) an off-licence must not be issued for any premises in the trust district, except—
(ii) for any premises on which any kind of alcohol is made

The intent of section 350 (1)(b)(ii) is to allow a premises that makes alcohol to sell those products.

Therefore, I recommend the applicant be issued an OFF license with the following conditions:

a) Alcohol may be sold only on the following days and during the following hours: **Monday to Sunday – 9.00 am to 9.00 pm**

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- b) No alcohol is to be sold or delivered on Good Friday, Easter Sunday, Christmas Day or before 1.00 pm on ANZAC Day.
- c) Each of the following parts of the premises is designated as a supervised area: The retail room and tasting area.
- d) When alcohol is being supplied free as a sample on the premises, potable drinking water must be freely available from filled jugs with glasses stationed on the main counter.
- e) The licensee must implement and maintain the steps proposed in the application for the licence including the Host Responsibility Policy aimed at promoting the responsible consumption of alcohol.
- f) The licensee must ensure the provisions of the Act relating to the sale and supply of alcohol to prohibited persons are observed and must display appropriate signs adjacent to every point of sale detailing the statutory restrictions on the supply of alcohol to minors and the complete prohibition on sales to intoxicated persons.

I also recommend that the District Licensing Committee consider imposing further conditions for the applicant to adhere to section 350 (1)(b)(ii) of the Act.


The licensed premises area is shown on the plan submitted on 6 September 2024.

Figure 1: Floor Plan








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Photo 3: Close up of the servery counter and the inside door into the brewery

Police inquired into this application. The applicant previously had a remote sales endorsed Off Licence which has expired. This is an application for a new Off Licence with no endorsement.

Although it is in the ILT zone Section 350(1)(b)(ii) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 makes this allowable.

It is not specifically stipulated in the Act what products are permissible for the Licensee to sell but it is the belief of the Police that the intention of this Section and Sub Section is to allow manufacturers and makers of alcohol to utilise an Off Licence sell their own products at a retail level from their premises, or products of a similar nature.

The applicant has provided details and the nature of what products they intend to stock and sell from their premises as per the following narrative -

What we are wanting to do is to sell the bulk of taps as Gadoochi beer/cider as this is where the largest amount of profit is for us, and have taps available for guest brewers to cover ourselves in case not all our customers want Gadoochi all the time. We also want to have for sale Gadoochi bottled products and bottled "craft beer" from other breweries. What we are not wanting to do is, sell RTDs, mainstream beers/ciders, mainstream spirits, anything that is readily available online at supermarkets or large bottle shops.

This application is not opposed with a recommendation the DLC consider imposing a condition on the Off Licence to ensure only alcohol as outlined by the applicant can be sold.

App for New OFF/187/2024 - Gadoochi Brewing Limited - New Off Licence Application

After inquiring into this application pursuant to Section 103 of the Act, Police reported on it by way of email on the 1st of October 2024. Police reported no opposition with a recommendation the DLC consider imposing a condition on the Off Licence limiting what alcohol/products the applicant can sell.

This was also based on information the applicant provided outlining what they intended to sell.

The Police stance has not changed, and the application is still not opposed. This is a supplementary report to further expand on reasonings behind the Police recommendation of the DLC giving consideration to imposing such a condition.

The content of this supplementary report is also only the perspective and understanding from a Police point of view.

Police believe there are numerous sections of The Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012 (SASAA) which bear relevance to this particular application.

Police believe the ability of the applicant to be issued an Off Licence is not in question, with the relevant sections of SASAA being met, including 105, 32(1)(d), 350(1)(b)(ii) and 32(2) - which seems to merely reiterate the provisions of 350(1)(b)(ii).

Once an Off Licence is issued, on the premises the licence is held for the licensee can sell alcohol for consumption somewhere else pursuant to 17(1).

The sections in SASAA that refer to offences and limitations on what kinds of alcohol that can be sold are 238,397 and 400. These are in relation to restricted and banned products and Police believe are not relevant here.

Police believe that the only way to put limitations in place is by way of a discretionary condition/s imposed on the licence. SASAA provides the DLC the ability to do this.

Usually, section 116 is relied upon for this to occur but in relation to this particular application section 116(1)(c) does not make this possible.

Police believe that in this particular instance the DLC could achieve this by relying on section 117. The DLC may issue any licence subject to any reasonable conditions not inconsistent with the Act.

It is the belief of Police that Section 350 of SASAA is to protect monopoly provisions of a Licensing Trust and that the intention of 350(1)(b(ii) is to allow makers and manufacturers of alcohol the ability to obtain an Off Licence for premises where they make alcohol in a trust district and sell products they make or manufacture, or products similar thereof.

The applicant has already alluded to products they intend to sell. Police are satisfied with this but believe a condition be imposed on the licence to ensure this occurs.

Police believe that without such a condition, once issued the Off Licence the applicant would be freely available to sell whatever alcohol they want pursuant to 17(1), and in effect could become more akin to a mainstream retail bottle store.

Once again, Police believe that this is not the intention of 350(1)(b)(ii) and Police are in no way suggesting the applicant in this case would do that, but without anything in place to prevent it anything is possible.

In summary, Police feel that the DLC should at least give consideration to imposing a restrictive condition for the reasoning as outlined and that it would be reasonable and consistent with the Act pursuant to 117. This is what led Police to making this recommendation.

I addition, it is the DLC who are the decision maker, and it is their decision alone whether or not to impose any discretionary conditions and if so, it is their decision what any condition entails.

The initial Police report and this supplementary report have been completed after inquiring into the application and the DLC must have regard to the matters dealt with in them pursuant Section 105(1)(k) of the Sale and Supply of Alcohol Act 2012.
